VISITOR INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

We welcome visitors, both seasoned and those new to naturism, who are genuinely interested in trying the clothes free lifestyle. As hopefully you may appreciate some try to visit for other reasons and we therefore have a more comprehensive set of guidelines and rules than a normal club campsite has. This is to ensure everybody feels both safe and relaxed whilst enjoying the club and its facilities. Please therefore read the following information and rules for a full understanding of them before entering into the visiting process.

Visitor registration: We have introduced an online registration procedure for all visitors to the club. This can be found on the VISITOR REGISTRATION page of our website www.whiteroseclub.com. Before your first / next visit you are required to complete the online registration form or if you have not previously registered with us. One of our volunteer booking team will then be in touch for further information or with the booking page password. Just follow the instructions to make your booking.

Types of visits: We receive day visitors, those staying overnight or longer using their own touring accommodation or tent and also have two static caravans which can be rented. Once registered these can all be booked through the online booking facility. Day visits for both singles are restricted to Monday to Thursdays only. Day visiting times are between 11:00 and 18:00. The club is closed to visitors out of season with the dates published on our main webpage.

Visitors: The duty member will be aware of your visit and your expected time of arrival. If you are significantly delayed then please inform the duty member so they are aware that you are still arriving. Upon arrival call the duty member on the provided number. Please be patient and allow some time as they may have to walk a fair distance. They will direct you to your allocated pitch / accommodation and provide you with all the details necessary for your stay.

On your first visit, you will be required to provide a photo identity e.g. a Passport or a driving licence and proof of your address e.g. a recent utility bill. You will not be admitted if you fail to bring these documents with you.

Payment: The website booking system requires payments to be made online prior to the visit and the booking team will confirm your full payments are made prior to your arrival. The duty member is unable to take any payment. This must be completed online prior to your arrival.

Charges: Fees for visiting the club are detailed on the website and online booking page. The bar is open on weekends and occasionally during the week and takes cash or card payments. We do have an honesty fridge and freezer with soft drinks and ice creams as well as coffee mornings on weekends which all require cash so it is worthwhile bringing some loose change with you.

Main Gate: To enter the club via the main gates a code is required. The code will be provided to you upon checking in for your visit. When leaving the club site ensure that the main gate has both drop poles in place and the side gate is secured. The front gate is locked around 20:00 hrs and opened again around 08:00 hrs. If you are intending to leave site whilst the front gate is locked please ensure you receive a gate key from the duty member.

Photography: Is strictly controlled and permission can only be given by a committee member. Casual taking of pictures or the flying of drones is therefore not permitted. Please switch off dash cams before entering the club site. If a visitor is found surreptitiously taking pictures they may be asked to leave the club with immediate effect.

Dress code: We are a naturist club and not a clothes optional club. We expect full nudity when the weather allows. This applies to all areas both in and out of all the clubs facilities including the woodlands. In particular no clothes are allowed in the swimming pool and sauna at all times. Please ensure hygiene is maintained by sitting on a towel at all times. For inclement weather we suggest using a dressing gown when walking between facilities. Newcomers to naturism usually need time to overcome their shyness and this is expected however we do ask that progress to full nudity is made in a timely manner.

Genital Adornments: Wearing of Genital adornments is prohibited within all areas of the club. Anybody doing so will be asked to either remove them immediately or leave the club.

Code of conduct: White Rose Club is a private members club that is pleased to allow visitors access. Continued visits are permitted subject to the visitor's acceptable behaviour. The club has a right at any time to ask any visitor to leave the club immediately and deny future access to anybody that it deems has transgressed club acceptability rules. The club will notify the visitor of the denial of access and any future bookings will be cancelled. The club will not enter into any correspondence concerning the reasons for denial of access and the club will not enter into an appeal process.

Children: Children under the age of eighteen are welcome when accompanied by adults. The adults will be responsible for them at all times. We have a outside play area, summer house with a selection of outdoor games and other facilities which are free to use (with supervision). The club wishes to welcome young families into naturism therefore we do not charge for children.

Driving courtesy: Do not exceed the 5 MPH speed limit. Please be courteous of pedestrians and the potential of children playing.

Manoeuvring onto your pitch: Please ensure your caravan towing hitch faces the road. Please park your car considerately on your pitch or in the nearest car park, as directed by the duty member.

Pets: We regret that apart from registered assistance animals / guide dogs, pets are not permitted.

Accidents: Emergency services can be contacted from the phone in the red telephone box outside the clubhouse. First aid boxes / defibrillator are available in the clubhouse / visitor centre. There are first aiders within the membership and their availability should be marked on the board at the entrance to the visitor centre. All accidents / near misses should be entered into the accident book located alongside the first aid boxes.

Wi-Fi: The club has recently upgraded its WIFI cover throughout the site. The connection is somewhat limited especially when the site is very busy and is more suited to browsing / light usage rather than full streaming. Cost is free to everybody. Ask for the password on checking in or on the noticeboards inside the clubhouse.

Clubroom: The main clubroom is open for use by all and incorporates a bar, toilets, swap book library, television, seating, darts and pool table. It is always open and warm. The fully stocked bar is manned at the weekends (at other times there may be members present who can serve you, please ask the duty member). Please ensure for hygiene reasons you always place a towel on your chair before sitting. Throughout the year the club has functions which we would love you to be part of. Please check with the bookings team when looking to book your visit.

Main Kitchen: We have a first class kitchen which is not open for visitor use. It does however provide tea / coffee / cakes / biscuits (for a small charge) on weekends at 10:30 and at many other times provides delicious meals for functions.

Visitors facilities: There is microwave available as well as tea / coffee facilities in the main clubhouse. We also offer (for a small charge) soft drinks and ice creams.

Bar: We have a very well stocked and managed bar within the Club House. The bar is fully managed and may only be opened / manned by our bar manager and trained members to comply with the bar licence. This also means that members / visitors are not permitted to bring or consume their own alcoholic beverages within the bar licenced area during bar opening hours. Drinks will be served in glasses for consumption within the club house but if wishing to take any drink outside to the veranda / poolside or BBQ area then you must request a plastic glass.

Bar opening hours are displayed by the entrance to the club house but the bar will usually be open Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holiday evenings and weekday evenings at the duty members discretion/training.

Washing drying facilities: The Doby Room is located to the rear of the Club House and include sinks and washing machine and dryer which can be paid for utilising the honesty box. Washing powder is not included. Also available in the Doby Room is an iron and ironing board (please do not remove from the Doby Room) and a visitors fridge freezer.

Dish Washing Facilities: There is a sink inside the Doby Room and two large steel sinks adjacent to the Doby Room where hot / cold water is available for dish washing.

Toilet (black and grey) waste disposal: There are three disposal sites available:

- 1. To the right hand side of the main toilet block (black and grey waste).
- 2. Adjacent to the Woodland toilet block (black waste only).
- 3. Adjacent to the Miniten Court toilet block (black waste only).

Please hose clean after use. Do not dispose of anything else but toilet paper with the waste.

Waste Bins: In an enclosure next to the front gate. Please bag all waste before placing in bins and ensure all boxes are flattened first. Please sort waste into the correct bins for recycling.

Showers: Situated in the main club house and a separate privacy suite attached to the main toilet block. A single shower is situated next to the pool for showering before entering the pool.

Toilets: Situated in the club house, the main toilet block adjacent to the club house including the privacy suite, the Woodland toilet block and the Miniten Court toilet block. The club house and privacy suite toilets offer limited disabled facilities. Please do not flush anything other than toilet paper with the waste. Please ensure the toilet is clean when finished. In the event of a lack of paper please inform the duty member.

Swimming pool: We are very proud of our heated open air swimming pool. It is open from April to October and is available for all to use. Water temperatures are very comfortable with typical temperatures of 28 to 30 deg C (86-90 deg F). Cleanliness levels of the water is maintained by an automatic filtration and dosing system so ensuring that the correct cleanliness and chemical levels are maintained. The pool is unsupervised therefore a competent person must be in attendance whilst anyone is in the pool. Parents or Guardians are responsible for supervising their children in their charge at all times. If the children are not strong swimmers they must wear the required safety flotation equipment (not provided by the club). No swimwear or any other clothing is allowed in the pool with the exception of toddlers where water proof nappies are required. Everybody using the pool must shower first. Running jumping or diving is prohibited. The pool steps are particularly slippery and care should be taken when using them. No glass or ceramic bottles or tableware is to be used within the pool area. Non-breakable plastic wear is available from the bar.

Sauna: Situated in the Club House next to the showers / toilets. There is an honesty box located on the cabinet to the left of the sauna entrance. A towel should be placed fully underneath you to prevent any sweat directly getting on to the wood. No clothing to be worn in the sauna.

Woodland Walk: The eleven acre woodland site offers a pathway leading through the woodland to the west of the camping field (far end away from the entrance). It is both secure and private and there is no access by the public. You can roam freely without clothes safe in the knowledge that the only people you may encounter are other fellow naturists. Pathways are safe to use however we ask that you take care as there may be the occasional trip hazard especially after high winds.

History: The club was founded in 1944. A history of White Rose Club is available to peruse in the visitor centre.

General: Use of disposable barbeques or any other hot device likely to burn the grass must be positioned off the ground. Please be aware that the club is run by volunteers and we would appreciate it if you cleaned up after using any of the facilities and before you leave. For more clarification on a particular subject please ask the Duty Member or a committee member.

A condition of visiting the club is you agreeing to the use of all the clubs facilities is entirely at your own risk.

Top Tips from previous visitors:

Remember to bring Dressing Gown / Bath Robe, flip flops or suitable poolside footwear and plenty of loose change for the teas / coffees / cakes / ice creams / soft drinks / sauna / washing machine etc.

The bar does accept card or cash payments.
